In this regard, the lack of social justice in our country, the attitude to personnel, the opportunity for them to show their talents, honesty and transparency in recruitment and selection of personnel, also contributed to the emergence of these cases. However, in today's era of reforms, one of the most important social tasks is to ensure a fair social environment, the rule of law, the rights and freedoms of citizens, as well as a sense of belonging to them. One of the important tasks is to impose such a task on the education system, to form new principles of influencing young people by changing teaching methods, to teach them to love, serve and always understand that they are connected with the homeland.
